

Camp Curiosity Covid Checklist



- **Face Coverings**

- All campers and staff are required to wear masks unless when eating and drinking.
- Staff who mix between groups will wear a 3-ply disposable medical mask.

- **Healthy Hygiene Practices**

- Hands will be washed with soap and water before each meal or snack break. Camp staff will discuss with campers the importance of proper hand washing with soap for 20 seconds.
- Camp staff will have hand sanitizer available and will offer sanitizing or hand washing after each activity with shared materials.

- **Health screenings for youth and staff**

- We ask that all full/part-time staff, volunteers and campers self-check for any symptoms at home. Should you have any symptoms, we ask that you stay home and get tested for COVID-19 to ensure the safety of all.
- Anyone exposed to a known case of COVID-19 must receive a negative test before coming to camp.
- If a camper exhibits symptoms while at camp, staff will escort the camper to a separate location and notify parents for immediate pickup. MOSAC requests that we be notified if symptoms continue and if there is a positive COVID test.

- **Physical Distancing:**

- All activities and camp areas will allow for 3 feet of distance between all participants. Staff will stay 6 feet away whenever possible.
- Support staff (such as floats, coordinators, etc.) will keep a 6-foot distance from all campers unless providing age-appropriate support.

- **Identification and Tracing of Contacts**

- Kathryn Hensley is MOSAC's main contact for Sacramento County Public Health.
- In the event of a confirmed case of COVID-19, Kathryn will oversee contact tracing, including alerting the local health department and all those who were in contact with person testing positive.

- **Identification and Reporting of Cases:**

- Camp Curiosity will cooperate with local health authorities to report and identify any positive cases.

- **Communication Plans:**

- If there is a confirmed case of COVID-19, camp leadership will send an email to each exposed person with no mention of the name of the individual testing positive.
- Staff will phone all camp parents whose children are in the affected group.
- Leadership staff will be available to parents who have questions.

- **Stable Group Structures:**

- Campers will be in stable week-long groups of up to 12 kids, 1 staff member and 1 volunteer (or 2 staff and no volunteers).
 - There is allowance for 1-2 more adults to be added to these stable groups, taking group sizes up to 16 when extra support is needed.
- Groups will not share indoor space and will not intermingle without distancing outdoors.

- **Staff Training and Family Education:**

- MOSAC's COVID-19 Safety Plan is posted on our website: www.visitmosac.org

- In all camp communications prior to camp, MOSAC has encouraged families to discuss the safety plan with their campers, as well as practice mask wearing and proper hygiene practices.
- All staff and volunteers will receive specific training regarding our COVID-19 safety practices and guidelines.
- Staff and volunteers will also be encouraged to ask questions, speak up if something seems unsafe, and to advocate for their campers and their own safety throughout their employment.
- **Transportation:**
 - MOSAC will not be using any buses or transportation.
 - Some school districts attending camp will be using buses to transport students, and will be carrying out their own safety measures.
- **Entrance, Egress, and Movement within the Supervised Youth Activity Setting:**
 - All drop-off and pick-up will be curbside, parents and guardians will not be allowed in the camp areas.
 - The museum is a large open building, and groups moving through will have ample space for social distancing.
 - Common areas, such as lunch storage, will be entered with caution one group at a time.
